We could consider Salsa in the Park (that happens at Blackstone park).

### Other/New Items

Emily Nelson reached out to Karen Gonzales about donating clothes/stuff from the house to the school. If anyone has stuff they want to donate, the school will take them.

Barbara has been in touch regarding grant writing - to broaden our reach and involvement with other people within the neighbourhood. In the past, she wrote a number of grants focusing on literacy support, but got only rejections from large financial institutions. It may work if there were no salaries involved, and specific needs - technology in the classroom, for example. BPS has resources that can help guide us a bit. A charter school model - having a Board of Trustees, may be a more successful model.
